WHEREAS; according to the National Institutes of Health, vitiligo is a chronic autoimmune disorder that causes patches of skin to lose pigment or color; and

WHEREAS; it is estimated that vitiligo affects around one percent of the population worldwide, and the condition can develop at any age and in individuals of all genders, races, and ethnicities; and

WHEREAS; vitiligo is not contagious and is not typically physically painful, although the psychological and social effects are well-documented and can be especially devastating to children and people of color; and

WHEREAS; in 2022, the Food and Drug Administration approved the first-ever drug to treat vitiligo, allowing for the progressive re-pigmentation of an individual's skin; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins dedicated individuals and organizations across the state, including Wisconsin VITFriends and the Ja'Hirah Darielle Foundation, in spreading awareness of vitiligo, providing advocacy and support for affected individuals, and promoting acceptance;

> NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim June 25 2023 as

WORLD VITILIGO DAY

throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance to all our state's residents.
