WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins the DNR and the more than 600 organizations and thousands of volunteers dedicated to the stewardship of Wisconsin lakes in promoting the preservation of the natural environment for the benefit of all Wisconsinites;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim July 2023 as
