

WHEREAS; Wisconsin women share a deep-rooted history of conservation and have long played an important role in the stewardship of land and water resources in the state; and

WHEREAS; according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA), as of 2022, more than half of all U.S. farming operations had at least one woman operator, and data from the 2022 USDA Census of Agriculture estimates that there are 37,600 female agricultural producers in Wisconsin, making up approximately 35 percent of all agricultural producers in Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS; women landowners in Wisconsin understand the importance of collaborative conservation and are champions of conservation practices, such as the utilization of cover crops and pollinator habitats, the protection of native species, and regenerative agriculture; and

WHEREAS; in collaboration with its state agencies, the state of Wisconsin offers many resources and technical supports for women landowners and landowners of all backgrounds, especially those who are beginning their conservation journeys; and

WHEREAS; this week, the state of Wisconsin joins women landowners and farmers across the state in celebrating the essential contributions made by women in conservation and to the prosperity of the agricultural industry as a whole;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
