

WHEREAS; commonly known as “The Forgotten War,” the Korean War began on June 25, 1950, following North Korea’s invasion of South Korea, and ended in a ceasefire, marked by the signing of an armistice on July 27, 1953; and

WHEREAS; approximately 132,000 Wisconsinites were among the more than 1.7 million members of the United States Armed Forces who endured harsh combat and severe climatic conditions during the war; and

WHEREAS; more than 30,000 U.S. service members, including approximately 800 from Wisconsin, gave their lives in service to the country during the Korean War; and

WHEREAS; in Wisconsin, there are more than 20,000 living veterans of the Korean War, who the state commends for their selfless service and sacrifice; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins all Wisconsinites and all Americans in thanking Korean War veterans for their immense bravery and sacrifice in service to the state and nation;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim July 27 2024 as

KOREAN WAR VETERANS ARMISTICE DAY

throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance
to all our state’s residents.
