# Proclamation

*WHEREAS*; established in 1973, the Bearskin State Trail is a scenic, multi-use recreational trail that serves Wisconsinites year-round; and

*WHEREAS*; named after its position along the Bearskin Creek, the Bearskin State Trail runs 21.5 miles between the communities of Minocqua and Tomahawk, following the path of a historic railroad line that was constructed to export white pine logs from the forests of northern Wisconsin to major midwestern cities; and

*WHEREAS*; the Bearskin State Trail was designated as a National Recreational Trail in 1978; and

*WHEREAS*; the Bearskin State Trail showcases 16 converted railway trestle bridges and opportunities for four seasons of scenic beauty, including dense forest, creeks, natural springs, spruce and tamarack bogs, and lakes; and

*WHEREAS*; the Bearskin State Trail provides a nearby connection to the Northern Highland American Legion State Forest and Hiawatha Trail, which provide recreation, conservation, and economic benefits to the region; and

*WHEREAS*; on this occasion, the state of Wisconsin joins all Wisconsinites in celebrating 50 years of the Bearskin State Trail and its many contributions to tourism, recreation, and stewardship in the state;


*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim August 2023 as
