

WHEREAS; community health centers across the United States—including the 19 community health centers in Wisconsin that receive federal community health center grants—have provided underserved communities with high-quality, affordable, and comprehensive primary and preventive healthcare for decades; and

WHEREAS; according to the Health Resources and Services Administration, in 2022, more than 30.5 million people received care from a community health center, including more than 24 million uninsured, Medicaid, and Medicare patients and over 9.6 million rural residents; and

WHEREAS; community health centers play a critical role in filling gaps in traditional care networks and are constantly developing new ways to integrate services beyond primary care—including oral health, behavioral health, pharmacy services, treatment for substance use disorders, school-based care, and services for special populations, such as agricultural workers, individuals experiencing homelessness, and veterans—to meet the needs and challenges of their communities; and

WHEREAS; the community health center model continues to prove effective in helping individuals overcome barriers to healthcare access—such as geography, income, and insurance status—and reducing overall costs of care by helping to manage patients’ chronic conditions and keep them out of costlier healthcare settings; and

WHEREAS; National Health Center Week provides the opportunity to celebrate the nation’s health center organizations, service delivery sites, and the dedicated staff, board members, and patients who are responsible for their continued growth and success; and


