WHEREAS; while the lake holds incredible significance to the state, the lake has unfortunately experienced shoreline erosion, flooding, pollution, and the everyday harmful effects of climate change; and

WHEREAS; for 12 years, Lake Michigan Day, hosted by Lake Michigan Stakeholders in partnership with Lakeshore Natural Resources Partnership, has brought together researchers, community leaders, expert conservationists, and more to bring about and encourage collaborative, community-focused water and land conservation work to further restore and protect Lake Michigan and the broader Great Lakes Basin; and

WHEREAS; the state is committed to protecting Wisconsin's navigational and recreational waters, investing in conservation, and working to ensure that every Wisconsinite has access to clean drinking water, and the collective work of dedicated individuals, organizations, stakeholders, and businesses, as well as Tribal and government leaders across Wisconsin is paramount to fulfilling that mission; and

WHEREAS; on this occasion, the state of Wisconsin joins all Wisconsinites in recognizing Lake Michigan Day and in thanking everyone involved for their service and leadership in conservation to restore and protect the water resources vital to the Wisconsin way of life;
