WHEREAS; Wisconsin's brandy consumption dates back to 1893, when the sweet, fruity liquor was first introduced in the Midwest at the Chicago World's Fair, and today, according to the company, Wisconsinites are the number one consumer of Korbel brandy in the United States, accounting for nearly half of the company's annual brandy sales; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin's small businesses and local distilleries specialize in crafting small-batch brandy for the enjoyment of people here in Wisconsin, as well as for export worldwide; and

WHEREAS; the tradition of the Wisconsin Brandy Old Fashioned has inspired amateur bartenders, professional mixologists, and restaurant owners from around the world to make this renowned staple and add it to their menus; and

WHEREAS; for generations, Wisconsin's family-owned supper clubs have worked to perfect the Wisconsin Brandy Old Fashioned, and thousands of hardworking Wisconsinites—including small business owners and employees—harvest, handcraft, and deliver the ingredients found in this Wisconsin favorite for the enjoyment of folks in our state, coast-to-coast, and around the world; and

WHEREAS; today and throughout this month, the state of Wisconsin joins Old Fashioned enthusiasts across our state in reflecting on the rich history of the Wisconsin Brandy Old Fashioned and in supporting local distilleries, bars, restaurants, and supper clubs by responsibly enjoying this signature drink;
