WHEREAS; the tradition of the Wisconsin Brandy Old Fashioned has inspired amateur bartenders, professional mixologists, and restaurant owners from around the world to make this renowned staple and add it to their menus; and
WHEREAS; for generations, Wisconsin’s family-owned supper clubs have worked to perfect the Wisconsin Brandy Old Fashioned, and thousands of hardworking Wisconsinites—including small business owners and employees—harvest, handcraft, and deliver the ingredients found in this Wisconsin favorite for the enjoyment of individuals in the state, coast-to-coast, and around the world; and
WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins Old Fashioned enthusiasts across the state in reflecting on the rich history of the Wisconsin Brandy Old Fashioned and in supporting local distilleries, bars, restaurants, and supper clubs by responsibly enjoying this signature cocktail;
