Proclamation

WHEREAS; while a large part of the U.S. population is eligible to donate blood, only about three percent do, which can result in a lack of sufficient blood supply to treat patients, including those with serious injuries or in need of surgical procedures, and more; and

WHEREAS; one blood donation has the potential to help save the lives of up to three patients, underscoring the importance of constantly replenishing Wisconsin's blood supply through donations and community awareness; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin is home to numerous organizations committed to raising awareness of the importance of blood donation, including the American Red Cross, Versiti Blood Center of Wisconsin, and more; and

WHEREAS; today, we are reminded of the Wisconsin values of kindness, respect, empathy, and compassion, which we can all embody through supporting local blood drives;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim September 4, 2023, as

WISCONSIN BLOOD DONATION DAY


throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance
to all our state's residents.
