WHEREAS; according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, fetal alcohol spectrum disorders (FASDs) refer to a wide range of conditions that can occur when an individual is exposed to alcohol before birth; and

WHEREAS; FASDs affect individuals differently, and symptoms can include poor coordination, memory issues, learning disabilities, speech and language delays, vision and hearing problems, and issues with the heart, kidneys, and bones, among other difficulties; and

WHEREAS; while there is no cure for FASDs, early diagnosis, a stable and safe home life, medication, and behavioral therapy can improve child development; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins affected individuals, families, and dedicated advocates and organizations in spreading awareness of the harm of consuming alcohol while pregnant, promoting prevention, treatment, and recovery support services for individuals struggling with substance use disorders, and decreasing the stigma surrounding FASDs;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim September 9, 2025, as

INTERNATIONAL FETAL ALCOHOL SPECTRUM DISORDERS AWARENESS DAY
