WHEREAS; DSPs provide essential support to individuals with disabilities, helping them stay connected to their family, friends, coworkers, and communities and empowering them to live their most independent and fulfilling lives; and

WHEREAS; DSPs are trained to provide a broad range of individualized support services and are committed to supporting informed choices and person-centered practices that honor and respect the individuals in their care; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin is committed to training, employing, and retaining DSPs, and the Wisconsin Department of Health Services has worked in conjunction with the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay to create a Certified Direct Care Professionals program to train, certify, and register new DSPs, creating a more robust and prepared workforce across the state; and
