WHEREAS; on this occasion, the state of Wisconsin joins Wisconsinites in championing the importance of adult education, recognizing the achievements of adult learners, and celebrating the dedicated work of literacy providers, educators, volunteers, and supporters who contribute to the success and advancement of adult education in Wisconsin;
