# Proclamation

*WHEREAS*; for over 30 years, Hispanic Heritage Month has been celebrated across the United States to recognize the countless social, cultural, economic, and historical contributions of United States residents who trace their roots to Spain, Mexico, Puerto Rico, and the Spanish-speaking nations of Central America, South America, and the Caribbean; and

*WHEREAS*; Hispanic Heritage Month begins annually on September 15 in honor of the independence days of five Central American countries, Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua, and spans 31 days, further encompassing the independence days of Mexico, Chile, and Belize; and

*WHEREAS*; the most recent data from the United States Census Bureau estimates that Hispanic residents make up approximately one-fifth of the United States population, and Hispanics and Latinos make up an estimated 7.6 percent of Wisconsin's population, composing the second-largest racial or ethnic group in the country and the fastest growing constituency within the state; and

*WHEREAS*; Hispanic Wisconsinites continuously strengthen local economies and communities through entrepreneurship and contributions to the arts, industry, government, education, healthcare, and more; and

*WHEREAS*; Hispanic leaders have also been, and continue to be, prominent voices in many of the nation's social and political movements, advocating for issues that affect the Hispanic community—including education, housing, economic prosperity, civil rights, and immigration reform—and throughout the 20th century, in particular, were critical players in the efforts to promote equity and opportunity for students and to advance labor rights and protections for workers; and

*WHEREAS*; hate, injustice, and anti-Hispanic rhetoric and fear in all its forms must be dispelled through education, awareness, and meaningful action so that Hispanic communities across Wisconsin and the nation can continue to thrive; and

*WHEREAS*; Wisconsin is home to a vibrant and growing Hispanic community, and this month, the state of Wisconsin joins the many organizations across the state that work tirelessly to advance the economic and social interests of the Hispanic community in reflecting on the cultural heritage, collective resilience, and countless contributions of Hispanic Wisconsinites to the state and country;

*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,  
do hereby proclaim September 15 – October 15, 2025, as
