

WHEREAS; farmers, ranchers, growers, producers, foresters, and other agricultural workers play an essential role in the health and well-being of folks across the state, supplying nutritious food, economic prosperity, and a dignified way of life for generations of Wisconsinites; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin is home to more than 58,000 farms on 13.8 million acres of land, and Wisconsin’s agricultural industry provides 435,700 jobs—or almost 12 percent of the state’s total workforce—and contributes \$104.8 billion to the economy annually; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin’s agricultural industry has historically generated millions of dollars for the tourism industry, with dedicated agricultural tourism businesses driving business impact sales by offering visitors family-friendly and experiential farm-based entertainment activities, such as farm-to-table events, corn mazes, pumpkin patches, harvest festivals, farm stays, and weddings; and

WHEREAS; the state of Wisconsin is committed to training and supporting the next generation of agricultural professionals to meet the world’s growing demand for agricultural education and entertainment, food, feed, fuel, and fiber, and as one of the leading agricultural states in the nation, the state will continue to be at the forefront of this exciting and growing industry; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsinites recognize the farm, ranch, aquaculture, and agroforestry operations across the state for the important work they do to create and grow markets for local farm products and foods, build a greater understanding of agricultural tourism, and provide education, recreation opportunities, active-involvement experiences, retailing and hospitality facilities, and services for the enjoyment of locals and visitors alike; and

WHEREAS; this fall season, the state joins Wisconsinites in honoring the dedicated farmers, ranchers, growers, producers, foresters, and agricultural professionals across the state and in recognizing the importance of agriculture and agricultural tourism to Wisconsin’s cultural and economic livelihood;
