WHEREAS; according to the Association for Frontotemporal Degeneration, frontotemporal degeneration (FTD) represents a group of underdiagnosed neurodegenerative diseases that affect thousands of individuals across the United States, including many in Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS; also commonly referred to as frontotemporal dementia, frontotemporal lobar degeneration, or Pick's disease, FTD impacts the frontal and temporal lobes of the brain, causing a wide range of symptoms, including impairments to speech, personality, behavior, and motor skills; and

WHEREAS; oftentimes, FTD is misdiagnosed as Alzheimer's disease, depression, or a psychiatric and behavioral disorder, and it can take an average of over three years from the start of symptoms for an individual with FTD to receive an accurate diagnosis; and

WHEREAS; research shows that FTD has an earlier onset than other forms of dementia, and roughly 60 percent of people living with FTD are 45 to 64 years old; and

WHEREAS; while there is currently no known cure for or treatment to slow the progression of FTD, care plans often work to mitigate symptoms using medication and therapies; and

WHEREAS; patients and families affected by less widely known rare diseases, such as FTD, often bear a large share of the burden in finding a medical expert, funding research, and raising public awareness to support research into effective and affordable treatments; and

WHEREAS; this week, the state of Wisconsin joins all affected individuals, their families, and dedicated individuals and organizations across the state in spreading awareness of FTD, supporting research, and embracing hope for improved treatments and a cure;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim September 21 through 28 2025 as

throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance to all our state's residents.
