WHEREAS; diaper need is the condition of not having a sufficient supply of diapers to ensure that babies are healthy, clean, and dry, which can adversely affect kids and families, often disqualifying them from participating in quality child care and early education programs; and

WHEREAS; according to the National Diaper Bank Network, one in two U.S. families experience diaper need, and one in four parents report missing work because they are unable to afford the diapers required to leave children in child care; and

WHEREAS; without sufficient diapers, infants and toddlers risk infections or other health issues that may necessitate medical attention, further increasing financial struggles and disparities for families; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin recognizes that diaper need is a public health issue and addressing diaper need can improve economic opportunity, overall health, and quality of life for all families and communities across the state; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin is proud to be home to many trusted community-based organizations that recognize the importance of diapers and distribute diapers to families through various channels; and

WHEREAS; this week, the state of Wisconsin joins affected individuals, families, and dedicated advocates and organizations in raising awareness for and helping alleviate diaper needs across the state for the health and safety of all Wisconsin kids;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim September 23 through 29 2024 as
