# Proclamation

*WHEREAS*; established in 1988, Pregnancy and Infant Loss Awareness Month was created to recognize those impacted by pregnancy and infant loss nationwide; and

*WHEREAS*; it is estimated that approximately ten to 20 percent of all pregnancies end in miscarriage, one in 100 pregnancies are affected by stillbirth, and in 2021, the infant mortality rate, which measures the death of infants in the first year of life was 5.4 deaths per 1,000 infants; and

*WHEREAS*; often, the mental toll taken following pregnancy or infant loss surpasses the physical one, and resources, including support groups, professional counseling, and therapy services, exist across the state and nation to help those afflicted by loss; and

*WHEREAS*; the National Maternal Mental Health Hotline provides free and confidential access to trained counselors 24/7 in more than 60 languages and is available by calling 1-833-TLC-MAMA; and

*WHEREAS*; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins families, friends, and dedicated individuals and organizations across the state in honoring the memory and lives of those lost during pregnancy or infancy and showing encouragement and support for families forever devastated by their loss;

*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
