WHEREAS; other important services provided by professionals in this field include addressing and reducing pain for individuals who might otherwise rely on opioids or other pain medications that could result in ongoing reliance or challenges with substance use; and

WHEREAS; physical therapists, assistants, and students have historically played a vital role in rehabilitating members of the nation's armed forces and veterans with injuries, diseases, and disabilities; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins all Wisconsinites in thanking the physical therapists, assistants, and students who work every day to help Wisconsinites across the state stay healthy, active, independent, and pain-free;
