WHEREAS; health literacy refers to the capacity to find, comprehend, and utilize information and services about one's own health to make the best possible health-related decisions; and

WHEREAS; all people can be at risk of misunderstanding health information, particularly if the topic is distressing or complex; and

WHEREAS; healthcare workers and educators recognize that improving overall health and wellness is anchored in the ability to understand and use health information; and

WHEREAS; health literacy is a strong predictor of patient health outcomes, and improving health literacy among all Wisconsinites can be a powerful means of lessening costly hospital visits and preventing or mitigating many chronic and acute conditions; and

WHEREAS; an increasing reliance on digital platforms to connect people to health information and services often means that those without reliable access to high-speed internet are disadvantaged when it comes to health literacy access, and more must be done to expand informational accessibility to those who seek it; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsinites, healthcare professionals, community-based organizations, literacy programs, and local and state governments have a shared responsibility to improve health literacy and to support and disseminate accurate, science-based information, resources, services, and programming; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins healthcare providers, educators, researchers, and dedicated advocates and organizations in promoting health literacy in the state and beyond;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim October 2024 as
