

WHEREAS; according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, breast cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death among women in the United States, and metastatic breast cancer, or Stage 4 breast cancer, occurs when breast cancer spreads to other parts of the body, including the bones, lungs, liver, and brain; and

WHEREAS; breast cancer affects all races, socioeconomic classes, and genders, and the American Cancer Society estimates that more than 42,000 women and approximately 530 men will die from breast cancer in 2024; and

WHEREAS; through research and advocacy, advances have been made in the fight against breast cancer, and increased rates of early detection can be achieved through breast ultrasounds, magnetic resonance imaging, and genetic testing for hereditary breast cancer; and

WHEREAS; despite these advances, racial disparities in breast cancer persist, with Black women experiencing a disproportionately high rate of breast cancer mortality, underscoring the need for increased access to quality healthcare and breast cancer awareness in communities of color; and

WHEREAS; on this occasion, Wisconsinites are reminded that all people are at a lower risk for breast cancer when they have access to nutritious foods, physical activity, routine health screenings, preventative care, and the resources to live healthy lives; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin reaffirms its commitment to building a healthcare system that works for everyone and joins all breast cancer survivors, all those who are battling the disease, their loved ones, and the state's many dedicated healthcare workers and advocates in spreading awareness, committing to public education, and embracing hope for earlier diagnoses and improved treatments;
