WHEREAS; Wisconsin's farmers and food system workers play an essential role in the prosperity of rural and urban communities alike, providing local fruits, vegetables, dairy products, meats, and grains to all Wisconsinites and working diligently to nourish and maintain food access for the state's youth; and

WHEREAS; the Wisconsin Farm to School Advisory Council within the Wisconsin Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP) joins the National Farm to School Network in its commitment to ending inequities in the state's food systems and expanding nutrition security for all students; and

WHEREAS; as part of the National Farm to School Network, the Wisconsin Farm to School and Early Care and Education Network engage local food businesses, community leaders, educators, policymakers, parents, caregivers, and students in creating resilient food communities throughout the state and addressing disparities in access to program benefits; and

WHEREAS; in collaboration with the Wisconsin Farm to School Network, DATCP's Farm to School and Institution Program supports local food businesses, equitable food systems, and supply chain developments by connecting food suppliers to local procurement initiatives and educational opportunities, and in 2025, completed the Wisconsin Farm to School Grant pilot program, investing \$250,000 in eight initiatives across the state; and

WHEREAS; the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction (DPI) similarly supports student access to nutritious local foods, educational and enrichment experiences, and school garden development through school meal programs, procurement opportunities, and training for school food service professionals, and in August, DPI hosted its first Wisconsin Farm to School Summit, a collaborative meeting designed to bring together educational leaders to discuss strategies to promote health and knowledge of food systems; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins DATCP and DPI, along with kids, families, educators, and schools across the state, in expressing appreciation for local farmers, resilient and thriving local food systems, and school nutrition professionals;
