WHEREAS; the state of Wisconsin boasts over 1,100 4-H clubs and groups across the state, with students engaging in various projects, such as art, photography, woodworking, animal sciences, shooting sports, food and nutrition, and more; and

WHEREAS; 4-H helps connect young people and adults to their communities, preparing them for work and life experiences through experiential and inquiry-based learning while providing emerging research for positive youth development; and

WHEREAS; supporting future leaders in science, agriculture, and community leadership, research finds that participation in 4-H programs greatly influenced students' confidence, ability to develop a positive network, and participation in community service; and

WHEREAS; this week, the state of Wisconsin joins dedicated 4-H professionals, volunteers, students, families, and community partners in celebrating the work of 4-H programs across the state and commends everyone involved for their dedication to leadership, growth, and the success of Wisconsin's youth and families;
