
STATE of WISCONSIN

WHEREAS; this week, the state of Wisconsin joins doctors, advocates, and the healthcare industry in raising public awareness of the importance of eye health and vision care and in encouraging all Wisconsinites to proactively take care of their vision by seeking regular in-person, comprehensive eye exams by licensed optometrists;
