WHEREAS; healthy forests provide essential benefits, including clean air and water, wildlife habitat, carbon storage, flood mitigation, recreation, and scenic beauty, and this week, the state of Wisconsin encourages all Wisconsinites to recognize and celebrate forests for the resources they provide, as well as the important role that the forest products industry has played in the state's history, economy, and culture;
