WHEREAS; the American Bar Association has approved seven paralegal education programs across the state of Wisconsin in Cleveland, Eau Claire, Green Bay, La Crosse, Wausau, Madison, and Milwaukee; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins all paralegals, firms, and public institutions in recognizing the important services paralegals provide to the state and thanking paralegals for their exceptional work;
