

WHEREAS; winter in Wisconsin can result in severe hazards to the health and well-being of residents, which is why weatherization—the process of protecting buildings and households from the winter elements—is critically important; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin’s low-income households are disproportionately affected by the adverse effects of climate change, which include extreme temperatures during the winter, and are similarly affected the most by rising energy costs; and

WHEREAS; the Wisconsin Weatherization Assistance Program, part of the U.S. Department of Energy’s (DOE) Weatherization Assistance Program, works to reduce energy consumption and expenditures, as well as reduce the emission of greenhouse gases, by providing vital weather-related upgrades such as insulation, air sealing, high-efficiency heating systems, and energy-efficient appliances to eligible low-income households; and

WHEREAS; the Wisconsin Weatherization Assistance Program provides an economic boost for the communities it serves by producing more energy-efficient housing stock and improved neighborhood conditions, and it plays a role in creating employment opportunities to support a clean-energy economy and workforce; and

WHEREAS; in addition to supporting weatherization efforts, the state has also made additional investments in a variety of housing and energy assistance programs to ensure that, despite rising energy costs, no one must choose between keeping their homes warm and their families fed this winter season; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins the Wisconsin Weatherization Assistance Program in reaffirming its commitment to pursuing cost-effective energy efficiency practices, helping to make low-income communities more resilient to the effects of climate change, and improving the quality of life for all Wisconsinites year-round, regardless of income or ZIP code;
