WHEREAS; according to Cleveland Clinic, Alpha-1 antitrypsin deficiency (Alpha-1) is a progressive genetic condition that can cause damage to the lungs and liver; and

WHEREAS; common lung symptoms of Alpha-1 often include shortness of breath, wheezing, chronic cough, extreme tiredness, and frequent chest colds, and common symptoms of liver disease caused by Alpha-1 may include jaundice, itchy skin, leg or abdominal swelling, or throwing up blood; and

WHEREAS; research suggests that Alpha-1 often goes undiagnosed or misdiagnosed and that the majority of those with the disorder are unaware of their condition; and

WHEREAS; early diagnosis is associated with better disease outcomes, and increased awareness of Alpha-1 is essential to its detection and treatment; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins all affected individuals, their loved ones, and dedicated advocates and organizations across the state in spreading awareness of Alpha-1 in the hopes that further awareness and education will lead to earlier diagnoses, improved treatments and outcomes, and, ultimately, a cure;
