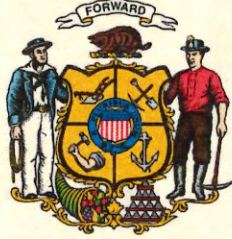

Proclamation

WHEREAS; this month provides all Wisconsinites with the opportunity to learn about hospice and palliative care options and thank hospice and palliative care providers across the state for their innumerable contributions to individuals and their loved ones in their time of need;
