

WHEREAS; Wisconsin’s emergency responders work tirelessly to save lives and keep the state’s roads and highways safe, responding to approximately 128,000 traffic crashes in Wisconsin every year; and

WHEREAS; at every crash scene, emergency responders—representing fire, law enforcement, emergency medical services, and towing and transportation services—are at risk of being struck and injured, or even killed, in a secondary crash; and

WHEREAS; each driver has a responsibility to drive safely and take every precaution to reduce the risk of secondary crashes, which includes following the state’s Move Over Law, designed to provide a safety zone for workers on the side of roadways; and

WHEREAS; 2021 Wisconsin Act 115 added additional protections for workers on Wisconsin’s roads by banning cellphone use in an emergency response area and creating a criminal penalty for traffic violations that lead to injuries in designated emergency zones; and

WHEREAS; this year marks the 10th annual Crash Responder Safety Week, reminding drivers to slow down and give space to emergency responders, and this year’s theme is “Safety Starts With You—Move Over or Slow Down”; and


