WHEREAS; first recognized by the United Nations in 2000, International Migrants Day serves as a day for the global community to recognize the resilience and bravery of those who have migrated from one country to another and the challenges they face; and

WHEREAS; migration has allowed for the coexistence and cultural exchange of people from every corner of the world and has facilitated the sharing of ideas, cultures, and traditions across borders; and

WHEREAS; the decision to leave one's home country can be daunting and, all too often, marks the beginning of a perilous, uncertain, and taxing journey; and

WHEREAS; in recent years, war, conflict, climate change, and insecurity have facilitated the forced movement of millions of international migrants, frequently funneling individuals from one turbulent environment into an equally turbulent path, too often marked by limited access to essential services, exploitation, and xenophobia; and

WHEREAS; all migrants have the right to safety and security throughout their travels and upon arrival at their intended destination and deserve to be treated with respect and dignity at every step of their journey; and

WHEREAS; recognizing the value and contributions that migrants bring to communities across Wisconsin, the state remains committed to welcoming migrants with excitement, acceptance, and receptiveness while helping them find new homes, communities, and opportunities; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin recognizes the rights of migrants everywhere and affirms its commitment to providing support to Wisconsin's migrant communities and to facilitating a safe and welcoming environment for all;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim December 18 2024 as

INTERNATIONAL MIGRANTS DAY

throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance to all our state's residents.
