## **EXECUTIVE ORDER #193**

Relating to a Proclamation that the Flag of the United States and the Flag of the State of Wisconsin Be Flown at Half-Staff as a Mark of Respect for Cameron Police Officer Hunter Scheel

**WHEREAS,** on April 8, 2023, Cameron Police Officer Hunter Scheel was killed in the line of duty at the age of 23;

**WHEREAS,** Officer Scheel graduated from the Law Enforcement Academy in 2022 and has served the Cameron Police Department with passion and dedication for the past year;

**WHEREAS,** additionally, Officer Scheel's commitment to service extended even beyond the Cameron community, having served as a member of the Army National Guard for six years;

**WHEREAS,** Officer Scheel will be remembered for his love of helping those around him, the kindness and compassion he shared with his community, and for the positive outlook he brought to service each day;

**WHEREAS,** the people of Wisconsin join Officer Scheel's family, girlfriend, friends, fellow officers, and Barron County in mourning his passing and honoring his memory; and

**WHEREAS,** services for Officer Scheel will be held on April 15, 2023, in Cameron, Wisconsin.

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, TONY EVERS**, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and the Laws of the State, hereby order that the flag of the United States and the flag of the State of Wisconsin shall be flown at half-staff at all buildings, grounds, and military installations of the State of Wisconsin, beginning at sunrise on Saturday, April 15, 2023, and ending at sunset on that date.
