- Serving as the state's pardon advisory board coordinator, including reviewing pardon applications for eligibility, coordinating pardon board hearings, and communicating with pardon applicants.
- Other duties as assigned, including assisting with public records requests and managing special counsel contracts for ongoing litigation.
