WHEREAS; communities across the State of Wisconsin have experienced devastating flooding in the last four years, which have led to homeowners, business people, and renters losing their homes and livelihood; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin has had three flooding disaster declarations since the beginning of 2019, the most recent of which resulted in an estimated \$30 million in damages across Kenosha, Milwaukee, and Racine counties; and

WHEREAS; the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration is anticipating an increased likelihood of spring flooding throughout Wisconsin in 2020 due to melting snowpack sitting upon already saturated soils; and

WHEREAS; as little as one inch of water in a home or business can cause approximately \$26,000 of damage, and traditional homeowner, business, and renter insurance products often do not cover losses from floods; and

WHEREAS; most disasters do not qualify for individual Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) assistance grants, which provide an average of \$4,300 in assistance, far below the average flood claim of \$46,000; and

WHEREAS; flood insurance is reasonably priced and available from the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP), a FEMA program, in participating communities throughout Wisconsin, and lower-cost flood insurance is also available to property owners in low to moderate flood risk areas;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim February 9 – 15, 2020, as

throughout the State of Wisconnecourage homeowners, business owners, and renters to purchase flood insurate to enable a speedy return to normal after a flood disaster.
