WHEREAS; Wisconsin's unpaid family caregivers provide billions of dollars' worth of care every year and often struggle to meet their own personal needs and employment responsibilities, as well as the needs of others in their households; and

WHEREAS; a shortage of paid caregivers and direct care workers in Wisconsin has resulted in persistent vacancies in care facilities and a lack of sufficient services to people with disabilities, aging and older adults, and their families; and

WHEREAS; even in the context of this workforce shortage and the ongoing coronavirus pandemic, caregivers in Wisconsin have continued to go above and beyond to serve the state's most vulnerable individuals; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin recognizes the innumerable contributions and sacrifices that both paid and unpaid family caregivers make in service to the health and well-being of Wisconsin's communities and reaffirms its commitment to expanding services that support caregivers throughout the state and ensuring that all Wisconsinites who depend on caregivers have access to affordable, quality care;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim February 17 2023 as

NATIONAL CAREGIVERS DAY

to all our state's residents.
