WHEREAS; March 10, 2023, marks the 64th anniversary of the peaceful uprising by the Tibetan people in Lhasa, the capital of Tibet, to protest the occupation by the People's Republic of China and honors the more than one million Tibetans who have died; and

WHEREAS; the suppression of human rights in Tibet must be the concern of all people who believe in freedom; and


WHEREAS; this day is meant to honor the brave people who have lost their lives in the pursuit of justice for Tibet; and

WHEREAS; today is a sacred day for Tibetans, as it is a significant mark in the historic struggle of people striving to free themselves from their oppressor;
