*WHEREAS*; there are over 250,000 practicing land surveyors worldwide, including more than 1,200 who are licensed to practice in the state of Wisconsin; and

*WHEREAS*; this occasion presents an opportunity for all Wisconsinites to appreciate the historic contributions of surveying as well as the sophisticated new techniques and technologies that are continually modernizing the profession; and

*WHEREAS*; this week, the state of Wisconsin joins all Wisconsinites in recognizing professional land surveyors for the important work they do for our state and communities around the world;
