WHEREAS; today, as we celebrate our state's workers in the fields of research, technology, science education, and medicine, the state of Wisconsin encourages all Wisconsinites to reflect on and share how advances in science have bettered their lives and those of their loved ones;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
