

WHEREAS; congenital diaphragmatic hernia (CDH) occurs during fetal development when the diaphragm fails to fully form, allowing abdominal organs into the chest cavity and preventing lung growth; and

WHEREAS; according to CHD International, more than 1,600 babies are born with CDH every year in the United States, including many in Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS; individuals with CDH often endure multiple surgeries and can experience medical complications, which can include pulmonary complications, gastric and intestinal problems, and developmental delays, and may require respiratory and medicinal support for years; and

WHEREAS; despite advances in science and medicine, the mortality rate for CDH remains high, and CDH continues to receive very little awareness and understanding compared to similar conditions; and

WHEREAS; raising awareness of CDH will help bring about acceptance and support for those living with the condition and help affected families advocate for urgently needed medical research and advances; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin recognizes the families throughout the state that have endured the pain and grief associated with the loss of a loved one with CDH and joins individuals, advocates, and organizations across Wisconsin—including CDH International—in increasing awareness of the condition, promoting research, and working towards improved patient care and outcomes;
