*WHEREAS*; centered around the 414 area code, which exclusively covers Milwaukee County and its 19 municipalities, Milwaukee Day is celebrated on 4/14 each year and serves as a call to Milwaukeeans—and Milwaukeeans at heart—to join in activities that promote and celebrate Milwaukee; and

*WHEREAS*; today, the state of Wisconsin joins the entire Milwaukee community in celebrating Milwaukee Day, honoring Milwaukee's proud history, and reflecting on Milwaukee's countless contributions to the fabric of the state and country;

*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim April 14, 2023, as

## MILWAUKEE DAY


throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance to all our state's residents.
