WHEREAS; a simple step that any individual can take towards preventing substance abuse disorder is to properly dispose of unused or unwanted medications through one of the many drug drop boxes and disposal sites located across our state; and

WHEREAS; Drug Take Back Day is a national campaign that aims to educate the public on the safe use, storage, and disposal of medications, providing folks with the means to safely, conveniently, and responsibly dispose of their unused or unwanted prescription drugs; and

WHEREAS; today, all Wisconsinites are encouraged to find their nearest drug disposal location by using the Drug Take Back locator tool through Dose of Reality Wisconsin's website and to safely dispose of any unwanted or unused medications for the health and safety of our families and communities;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim April 24, 2021, as

to all our state's residents.
