WHEREAS; each year, bankers and bank volunteers across Wisconsin make it a goal to educate students across the state about money, advocating for the importance of financial literacy by donating to schools and libraries, producing videos of bankers reading books on financial literacy, and providing teachers with instructions and activities for their students; and

WHEREAS; the Wisconsin Bankers Foundation has also developed a program—Reading Raises Interest—to encourage students to read, set goals, and save money; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin bank representatives serve on the Governor's Council on Financial Literacy and Capability, which is charged with examining and identifying strategies to measurably improve the financial literacy and inclusion of all Wisconsinites; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin encourages parents, educators, and community volunteers to continue instilling in kids the value of making smart financial decisions and providing them with good role models in handling their own finances;
