WHEREAS; the theme of this year’s National Nurses Month, “You Make a Difference,” highlights the unparalleled impact of nurses on the health, safety, and quality of care of patients, as illustrated by their incredible response to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin’s nurses continue to demonstrate compassion and respect for every patient, family member, and coworker, and profound resilience in the face of adversity as they continue to work around the clock to stop the spread of COVID-19 and restore the health and safety of our state; and

WHEREAS; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins all Wisconsinites in commending all nurses across our healthcare system—including primary care, long-term care, and public health nurses and nursing assistants—for their selflessness, sacrifice, and empathy on the frontlines of the COVID-19 pandemic, and for the important work that they do under ordinary circumstances to keep folks throughout our state safe, healthy, and supported;

NATIONAL NURSES MONTH


throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance
