WHEREAS; despite recent actions that we have taken which have resulted in advancements in water quality in our state, including investments in the removal of lead service lines, testing for dangerous contaminants, and other projects that address critical water infrastructure issues, we recognize that safe and reliable drinking water continues to be inaccessible for many in our state; and


