*WHEREAS*; this month, the state of Wisconsin joins brain tumor patients, their families, advocates, and dedicated organizations throughout our state in increasing public awareness of brain tumors through advocacy, supporting targeted research, and embracing hope for improved treatments and a cure;


*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim May 2022 as

## BRAIN TUMOR AWARENESS MONTH


throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance to all our state's residents.
