

WHEREAS; water is our most valuable natural resource, and ensuring access to clean drinking water is a public health priority; and

WHEREAS; in partnership with the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, 2019 was declared the Year of Clean Drinking Water across our state; and

WHEREAS; clean drinking water should be available to folks regardless of their zip code, and every Wisconsinite should be able to drink straight from their tap without fear of contamination; and

WHEREAS; we recognize that access to clean drinking water is not available for everyone in our state, and families from Milwaukee to Kewaunee and Marinette to Tomah are unable to get clean drinking water from their public water systems or private wells; and

WHEREAS; it is critical that we fund restoration projects, keep science at the forefront of our research and policy making, and work together to address widespread water contamination; and

WHEREAS; over the course of the Year of Clean Drinking Water, numerous actions were taken to improve our water quality, including the development of standards to protect Wisconsinites from contaminants such as perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) and nitrates; and



DRINKING WATER WEEK


throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance
