Proclamation

WHEREAS; a cancer survivor is anyone living with a history of cancer, from the moment of their diagnosis through the remainder of their life; and

WHEREAS; as of 2019, there were more than 16.9 million cancer survivors in our country, and the state of Wisconsin is home to a growing population of cancer survivors; and

WHEREAS; the American Cancer Society estimates that approximately 1.9 million new cancer cases will be diagnosed in the United States this year, including 37,320 in Wisconsin alone, which is why increased access to quality cancer care, screening, and prevention—especially in historically underserved communities—must be a top priority in our state; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins all Wisconsinites in recognizing cancer survivors in our state and across our country for their strength, advocacy, and resilience;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim June 5, 2022, as
