WHEREAS; in a world where one in 10 people are affected by foodborne illness each year, it is imperative to recognize food safety as essential to sustaining life and promoting good health; and

WHEREAS; we recognize that our food industry workers—from our farmers to our meat packers to the chefs in our restaurants and our grocery store employees—play a vital role in ensuring the safety of our food systems from production to consumption, and that food safety, nutrition, and security are inextricably linked and influence people’s lives regardless of state or natural borders; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins all Wisconsinites, all Americans, and folks around the world in reaffirming its commitment to collaboration between governments, producers, and consumers to ensure food safety worldwide;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim June 7, 2022, as
