*WHEREAS*; the goal of International Widows Day is to give widows a voice so that they can be heard, seen, understood, and served, and to empower women in widowhood to build resilience and make a positive difference in their lives with the support of their communities; and

*WHEREAS*; today, we recognize the crucial needs of widows in Wisconsin, across our country, and throughout the world, and affirm our commitment to building services, programs, and initiatives, and facilitating outreach, education, and community involvement to support women in widowhood worldwide;

*NOW, THEREFORE*, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim June 23, 2021, as
