

WHEREAS; gastroschisis is a condition characterized by the presence of a hole in the abdominal wall of a developing fetus, resulting in the growth of the intestines outside of the body; and

WHEREAS; it is estimated that approximately one in 2,229 infants in the United States are born with gastroschisis every year, with roughly the same rate of occurrence in Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS; while infants born with gastroschisis often undergo corrective surgery soon after birth, many experience serious lifelong complications, including failure to thrive, short bowel syndrome, feeding and digestive issues, and multiple organ transplants; and

WHEREAS; it is important to recognize that the families of infants born with gastroschisis often encounter a variety of problems outside of the condition itself, such as a sense of isolation and difficulties obtaining timely diagnoses, finding appropriate treatment options, and affording the few treatments that do exist; and

WHEREAS; since 2018, Avery's Angels Gastroschisis Foundation has been organizing a nationwide observance of Gastroschisis Awareness Day in honor of the founder's son, Avery John Rauhen, who passed away from complications of the condition on July 30, 2009; and

WHEREAS; today, the state of Wisconsin joins Avery's Angels, and all affected individuals and their families, in spreading awareness, promoting research, and honoring all those who are living with or who have lost their lives to gastroschisis;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Tony Evers, Governor of the State of Wisconsin,
do hereby proclaim July 30, 2021, as

GASTROSCHISIS AWARENESS DAY

throughout the State of Wisconsin and I commend this observance
to all our state's residents.
